MASONIC CAREER

He was initiated into Masonry in Palatine
Lodge No. 77, on the 5th Feb 1917.
Entered on Royal Arch Chapter "Arch
Benevolence" No. 177, on the 19th March 1917
and at the time of writing he holds the
office of Grand of that Chapter.

In October 1920 he was appointed as
Apprentice of Palatine Lodge on the
Board of Directors of the Riverside Masonic
Temple.

He is also Assistant Preceptor of the Lodge
of Instruction and takes a keen interest in
the training of those who are opening
to take office, and help to carry on the
future work of the Lodge.

As Bro. Fisher has been a very valuable
member on our Councils, and during the
time the Lodge was deliberating ways
and means for the raising of the necessary
funds for the building of the new Temple,
he proffered a sum which was
accepted not only by Palatine Lodge but
