Sir Robert Peat, D.D., highly distinguished for his accomplished manners and gentlemanly bearing, was an excellent scholar and a warm and devoted friend. He was an intimate friend of King George IV, who obtained for him the Living of Brentford, where he died at the Vicarage on April 21, 1837, aged 66 years.

He was born in Durham, and was the possessor of many Orders, including Knight of the Order of St. Stanislaus, conferred by the King of Poland.

He was also Prior of the Sovereign Order of St. John of Jerusalem, and Chaplain to the Orange Lodge of England.

Aug. 8. 1816

On Aug. 8. 1816, he joined this Lodge from the Lodge of Felicity, London, and on Nov. 14. 1816, was unanimously elected as W.M., but, owing to absence from the country, was not installed W.M., his duties being carried out by the S.W. Bro. W. Hodson.
