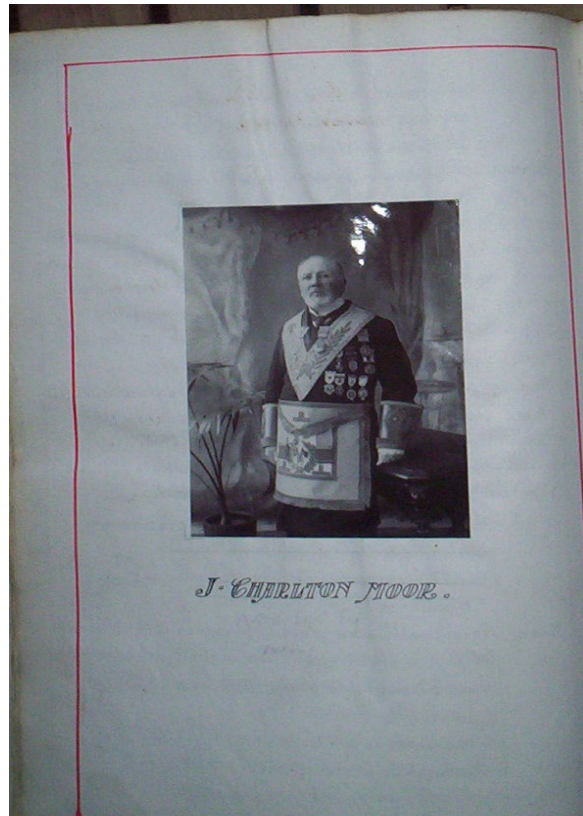

John Charlton Moor, P.G. Secy, was born at Becham on Sept 8, 1848, and at the early age of 15 years commenced his Journalistic career with the Weekly Newcastle Guardian, and 10 years later joined the Newcastle Chronicle Staff as their Branch representative. On June 1st 1877, he accepted his present post of The Sunderland's District Manager of the Newcastle Daily Journal, and in addition acting as the Representative of the Press Assocⁿ, Yorkshire Post, The Times, &c.

In addition to being a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Secretaries, and also of the Institute of Journalists since its Charter was granted by Queen Victoria, in which his name appears in the first List of Appointments, Bro. Moor is a Life Governor of the Newspaper Press Fund, of which he was, for several years, a Member of its Council.

MASONIC
CAREER

His progress in Masonry may be thus briefly sketched:—

1879. May 8. Initiated in Palatine Lodge & made Secy in same year.
S. II. 1880, J.W. 1881, S.W. 1882, W. M. 1883, and resigned in 1900 on completing 21 years membership. On Sep 10 1903, he was elected an Honorary Member of Palatine Lodge.

1884. appointed Rev. J.G. II. by the W. Master of London Lodge P.G.M.
1885. Installed second W. M. of London Lodge N^o 2039.
1895. appointed P.J.G.W. by Sir Hedworth Williamson P.G.M.
1902. Installed as the first W. M. of Wearmouth Lodge N^o 2937 of which his second son Bro. H. J. Moor, P.A.P. Secy, W. M. N^o 3095 was appointed J. II., and his eldest son was the first Initiate.

In the Higher Degrees. Bro. Moor has progressed in the

N^o 124, in 1888, and ranks as P.P.J.G.W.

Fosterians.
